New Retirement Contributions Limits For 2024

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has released new limits for certain retirement accounts for the coming year. Keep in mind that this update is for informational purposes only, so please consult with an accounting or tax professional before making any changes to your 2024 tax strategy. You can also contact your financial professional, who may be able to provide you with information about the pending changes.

Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs)

Traditional IRA contribution limits are up \$500 in 2024 to \$7,000. Catch-up contributions for those over age 50 remain at \$1,000, bringing the total limit to \$8,000. Remember, once you reach age 73, you must begin taking the required minimum distributions from a Traditional IRA in most circumstances. Withdrawals are taxed as ordinary income and, if taken before age 59½, may be subject to a 10% federal income tax penalty.

Roth IRAs

The income phase-out range for Roth IRA contributions increases to \$146,000-\$161,000 for single filers and heads of household, an \$8,000

increase. For married couples filing jointly, the phase-out will be \$230,000-\$240,000, a \$12,000 increase. Married individuals filing separately see their phase-out range remain at \$0-10,000. To qualify for the tax-free and penalty-free withdrawal of earnings, Roth 401(k) distributions must meet a five-year holding requirement and occur after age 59½. Tax-free and penalty-free withdrawal can also be taken under certain other circumstances, such as the owner's death.

Workplace Retirement Accounts

Those with 401(k), 403(b), 457 plans, and similar accounts will see a \$500 increase for 2024, the limit rising to \$23,000. Those aged 50 and older will continue to have the ability to contribute an extra \$7,500, bringing their total limit to \$30,500. Once you reach age 73 you must begin taking the required minimum distributions from your 401(k) or other defined-contribution plans in most circumstances. Withdrawals are taxed as ordinary income and, if taken before age 59½, may be subject to a 10% federal income tax penalty.

SIMPLE Accounts

A \$500 increase in limits for 2024 gives individuals contributing to this incentive match plan a \$16,000 stoplight. Much like a traditional IRA, once you reach age 73, you must begin taking the required minimum distributions from a SIMPLE account in most circumstances. Withdrawals are taxed as ordinary income and, if taken before age 59½, may be subject to a 10% federal income tax penalty. As a reminder, this article is for informational purposes only.
