

To open your Share Certificate, go online or visit a branch.

*This certificate is a two-year term. The rate may be increased once during the term up to 1.00% Annual Percentage Yield. The new rate will then be in effect for the remainder of the term. An additional deposit can be made once during the term and cannot exceed the original CD deposit; total balance cannot exceed \$500,000. The one-time withdrawal can be up to a maximum of 25% of the original CD balance. Amounts withdrawn in excess of the limit are subject to standard early withdrawal penalties. Certificate balance may not drop below \$2,500 per withdrawal. Federally Insured by NCUA.

HELPS Act Amendment in 2022 Offers Tax Benefits to Retired Public Safety Officers

The Healthcare Enhancement for Local Public Safety Act (HELPS) is part of existing federal tax law. It allows eligible retired public safety officers (law enforcement, firefighters, ambulance crew or rescue squad members, chaplains of police or fire departments) to exclude from gross income up to \$3000 in annual distributions from a governmental retirement plan to pay qualified health care insurance or long-term care insurance premiums.

Under the original HELPS Act, retired public safety officers would be eligible for the tax exclusion only if the payment of health care or longterm care insurance premiums was made directly by the governmental retirement plan to the provider of the health or long-term care insurance. This created many difficulties, as the local retirement system had to pay many different health care and long-term care providers and keep up with premium changes and deadlines. At the same time, many insurance providers will only communicate with the retirees, and not the local retirement system. As a result, many retirement systems decided to not implement HELPS, thereby resulting in retired public safety officers being ineligible for the tax benefit.

The SECURE Act 2.0 modified the HELPS Act in 2022 by making it optional for payments to be made by the local retirement system, allowing the distribution to be made to the retired public safety officer instead. The retiree could then make the premium payment to the provider and remain eligible for the tax exclusion. The retiree must also verify that the pension distribution does not exceed the cost of health insurance for the tax year.

Any public safety officer who has separated from service and has attained normal retirement age or separated due to a disability is eligible for HELPS. He or she must also be receiving his or her pension distribution.

Veterans of WWII, Korean or Vietnam Wars are being recognized for their sacrifices and achievements by the Central Valley Honor Flight organization. If you are a WWII, Korean or Vietnam Era Veteran, you can travel to Washington DC to visit the memorials there at no cost to you. Central Valley Honor Flight, a nonprofit organization, has been sponsoring flights for veterans since 2013, and has sent over 1,000 veterans to visit the national memorials. We would like to invite you to sign up for a flight. Priority is currently given to WWII veterans, but Korean and Vietnam vets are also honored, as space permits.
