REFCO Health Fair and Open Enrollment

We are pleased to announce the annual REFCO Benefit Plans Open Enrollment. Open Enrollment is your once-a-year chance to enroll in or make changes to your dental or vision plans. Pacific Group Agencies representatives will be at the REFCO Health Fair to explain how the plans work and to answer any questions you may have about the plans.

The annual Benefits Guides will be mailed out to all retirees, and you should receive your copy no later than October 15. The Benefit Guides are mailed to the address FCERA (not REFCO) has on file, so if you have moved, please make sure they have your current address. If for any reason you do not receive your copy of the Benefits Guide, you may pick one up at the Health Fair. Open Enrollment ends November 11, 2022. As always, if you are NOT making changes to your coverages, you do NOT need to return an enrollment form. Your coverages will continue for 2023. If you are making changes or newly enrolling, you may drop off your completed forms at the Health Fair with our representatives. As always, you may also mail or fax them to us.

One exciting change that will become effective January 1st, the Cigna HMO Dental Plan will have significantly more dentists to choose from. Cigna has agreed to allow members to use their expanded Dental Care Access Plus network. Not only are all the current HMO dentists covered by this new network, but thousands more nationwide, including around an additional 800 more dentists in California, are covered under this plan.

Details of any changes and the current rates will be detailed in the Benefits Guide.

Your Vision Health

Vision health is often an afterthought. Regular eye exams and proper eyewear can protect your vision health and may help identify other overall health issues.

Wear your sunglasses – Exposure to small amounts of ultraviolet (UV) radiation over a period of many years may increase the chance of developing cataracts, and may cause damage to the retina, which usually is not reversible.

Wear protective gear – Use safety glasses made of polycarbonate impact-resistant plastic to avoid eye injuries. Doctors also encourage anyone engaged in sports activities to wear protective eyewear.

Take frequent breaks – let your eyes rest.

Adjust your workstation – avoid Computer Vision Syndrome by ensuring your computer workstation is properly situated.
