

# **July Luncheon Benefits Highway City Community Development**

The REFCO Food Drive will benefit the Highway City Community Development (HCCD) organization. This private, non-profit, nondenominational organization was founded in 1995 to address the extreme poverty in and around Highway City and the surrounding communities. Their purpose is to stimulate economic development by not only collaborating with a variety of community groups but also enlisting the help and involvement of the impoverished families themselves in leadership roles - making changes for the better by building hope and stabilizing families.

The specific ways they are making these changes is by offering Job and Vocational Training, Life Skills and Leadership Training, Dignity Based Work Programs with the opportunity to work

for food, clothes and household needs, After School/Learning Center services, monthly Food Pantry distributions, and helping displaced children throughout the Central Unified School District.

An integral part of HCCD's efforts is the Highway City Thrift Store, which is located at 5472 W Shaw Ave. The proceeds from the thrift store go to support all the services they provide. In an effort to be 'green', the thrift stores takes items that do not sell due to wear and tear and partners with a local recycler to turn those items into insulation, rags, stuffing and more.

Those attending our July 19, 2018 luncheon will have an opportunity to help meet this need by donation food and or money to this collaborative community effort.
